International Literacy Day saw members reading to the iunior school at Gate Pa School. Much fun was had by all, in fact I hear that the readers didn't want to stop. In addition the senior school participated in a



Sell-a-Book competition which saw all entrants receiving a book, and we donated two books to the Bilingual class. In total we donated approximately 80 books on this day.

In September the club donated 11 hygiene kits to Tauranga Living Without Violence to give to participants in their Rangitahi programme. This donation brought one staff member to tears as she said how grateful their clients would be. She told us that sanitary products are always the first things to go from Good Neighbour donations and shared the story of a homeless client who has to keep her sanitary products in the cupboard at TLWV so that they don't get stolen.

We are always looking for new service and literacy projects and encourage all members to keep an eye out or ear to the ground for opportunities. Ideas for one off project would be particularly welcome.

The club voted to donate 20 Distraction Packs to this organisation - Editor.


## Program Committee Annual Christmas Cracker Making Goes off with a Bang!

## **ALTRUSA ACCENT**

With the announcement by the District Fifteen Board of Directors that all awards, except for the Margaret Inch Leadership Award will be retired with immediate effect I thought it would be pertinent to inform members of this prestigious award – *Editor*.

## The Margaret Inch District Fifteen Leadership Award

#### Background to the award

The District Fifteen Board has established the Margaret Inch Leadership Award as a memorial to the late Margaret Inch, Past Governor of District Fifteen (1987-1989) and Altrusa International President (1995-1997). The Award was presented for the first time at the 2009 District Fifteen Conference in Dunedin. Every Altrusa Club in District Fifteen is entitled to nominate one member per year. Previous winners are not eligible for nomination for a further five years.

Objective To recognise an Altrusan who has shown positive leadership in her community and who has demonstrated good leadership qualities within her Club. She will have led by example, and the leadership qualities she has shown will have encouraged fellow members to achieve their own goals, because of her focused and inspirational attitude.


#### **Eligibility Criteria**

The nominee must: -

- be a member, in good standing, of a District Fifteen Altrusa Club.
- have been an Altrusan for a minimum of five
   (5) years.
- have served as a Club Board member or Committee Chair.
- have attended at least one Area Training Day.
- have attended at least one District Conference within the last three years.
