Service Committee Report – Paula

There will be coats/jackets for purchase at the September meeting 5.30-6.00pm pm. We will give our time to Operation Christmas Hamper when needed and they will also receive some funds.

Membership Committee Report: Leanne



The membership committee met recently and reviewed our section of the annual plan. We reviewed the new membership process document and the new members FAQ, and this has been sent to the Board for approval. The Committee is responsible for organizing social events.

Robyn A will post on the messenger group any upcoming movie events, usually just with a few days notice so keep an eye out. Robyn M will continue to organize the monthly "Brunch Bunch."

We are updating our promotional materials. Robyn M has revised the club brochure, and we are updating the display boards for the Garden Ramble. Leanne has created a new club poster (that can house brochures) for the noticeboard at the Women's Hub. We will need your help with this to get any recent photos of members "active in service." Please email these through to Leanne's email.

We reviewed the August catering event with proceeds to go to the Conference Fund. In addition to this we will be holding a garage sale in Feb 2026 to top this up to support members attending Wellington Conference in May 2026. This fund also provides funding for our members to attend the IFF Day at no cost. This year the IFF day is being held in Morrinsville on the 20th of September – so save this day in your calendar.

The membership committee will be asking for some support from the Garden Ramble (via the club "net proceeds deduction" amount of \$500) to support the conference and training fund.

Without continuing to invest in the training and development of our club leaders, clubs struggle to operate effectively. All members are encouraged to attend IFF Day and Conference, regardless of the length of membership.

Proposed motion: Moved that \$500 from the club "net proceeds" deduction from the Net Garden Ramble proceeds be allocated to the Conference fund.

Literacy Report: Shona

On Saturday 16th August the Literacy Committee hired a movie theatre and invited Grandparents looking after grandchildren full time to come and enjoy a free movie afternoon. There were 70 guests, plus Vicky and myself who organised the event.

Ten tickets were returned due to sickness and a tangi. Wanting to fill these seats, I went out onto the street to see if I could give the tickets away. I found a grandmother with three children who thanked me but said she was too busy. Evidently three children can be very persuasive as they turned up to watch their very first movie. A group of ten people who had been gathered up to fill the ten seats by the guests who couldn't come arrived, so although they didn't fit the criteria we were happy to have all seats filled.

Everyone had a great time with six \$20 Paper Plus vouchers given away as spot prizes. One family came from Tokoroa, while others came from Cambridge, Otorohanga and Te Kuiti. There was a popcorn trail going up the stairs before the movie and lots left on the floor afterwards. Luckily we haven't been charged extra for a cleaning fee.

Morning Teas: Citizens Advice Bureau will serve at Rosenvale and Riding for the Disabled will serve at one of two venues on Ohaupo Rd.


Sponsorship: Club members have been asked to make contact with potential sponsors. We would like to have these locked in by the end of August so we can add them to the website.
