
None of us won one of the two raffles sadly!! The catering was excellent finger food and as always - far too much for the numbers attending ©

Denys introduced our speaker for the evening, Leala Faleseuga, who is the digital inclusion librarian at Te Takeretanga o Kura-hau-po. Leala's role is making sure everyone has everything they need to access online digital technology. She is a

passionate librarian born and breed in the Levin. Leala had a love for the library since she was young. After leaving to study and gain work experience she returned to Levin in 2017 to take up a librarian role at the Shannon library.

Libraries are important - are more than just books. They provide our community with equitable information to change lives. A 2025 survey shows increased use in books, digital services and in library services such as access to newspapers, magazines. Leala outlined what was available at our local libraries, Te Takeretanga o Kura-hau-po (Levin), Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom (Foxton) and Shannon.

Core Library Services

- Free Membership for residents of Horowhenua, Kapiti, and Manawatū Districts
- Borrowing physical books, eBooks, and eAudio books
- **Online Catalogue** for browsing and reserving items

Digital & Research Tools

eLibrary Access: Thousands of digital resources including newspapers, research databases, and study materials

- Public Computers: Free access with a library card
- Free Wi-Fi: Available 24/7 at all branches
- Tech Help & Digital Skills Support: Community learning sessions and one-on-one librarian bookings

Children & Youth Services

- Children's Library: A vibrant collection of books and regular events with entertainers
- Youth Space: A hangout and entertainment area for youths
- School Holiday Programmes and reading challenges

Heritage & Local History

- Heritage Rooms: Resources for genealogy and local history research
- Museums & Exhibitions: Especially at Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom, showcasing local stories and culture

Learning & Community Support

- Learning Support: Help with family history, personal research, and digital literacy
- Community Programmes: Workshops, talks, and events for all ages

Cornflake Ginger Crisps

125 g butter, softened
½ cup raw sugar
1 egg
1 ½ cup self raising flour
2 cups cornflakes, roughly crushed

beat butter and sugar in a bowl until creamy. add egg and beat until combined.

60 g (1/2 cup) glace ginger, finely chopped

add glace` ginger with shifted flour and stir until the mixture is well combined.

roll tablespoons of the mixture into the crushed cornflakes.

place on a lined baking tray.


flatten slightly with your finger tips.

Bake at 180C in a preheated oven for 10-12 minutes until golden

stand for 5 minutes and then transfer to cooling racks.

Makes about 22 and will keep for several days in an airtight container


Rotary Club Guest Speakers for remainder of the year

Logan Wilson from Rotary shared their Club's Guest speakers for remainder of 2025.


Rotary continue their Open nights, the next one is October 14 Meal Cost \$30. If you wish to go you must ring Paper Plus by Close of Business on Monday.
