**Manuella:** As head student she has championed inclusivity and community, supporting Brazilian students and families by bringing their stories and perspectives to the fore. She leads with compassion and empathy and purpose.

She has been recognised as one of Aotearoa New Zealand's 25 Inspiring young wahine changemakers, through the YWCA Y25 programme, an acknowledgement of her drive to create meaningful, lasting change Academically she excels with Distinction in Business Studies and Commendations in History and Statistics. She has already gained NCEA level 3 with an Excellence endorsement. Earlier in the year she was awarded both Ad Alta and Excellence Gold Awards.

Beyond the classroom she has graced the stage in 'Mamma Mia'. represented the school at the Westpac Women in Business Conference and earned Service Blues for her creative contributions to TOI Wearable Arts and Showquest. On Ice she has reached the pinnacle of her sport, representing NZ in the U!\* Womens Ice Hockey Team.

She is a leader, an artist, an athlete and a true Changemaker.

**McKellar:** Has left a profound and positive legacy. Excelling in both sport and arts and culture, he is a dedicated leader.

In sport he has been recognised with a Blues for his performance in the U17 Coxed Quad Sculls at the Maadi Cup. He has represented the school in rugby and basketball.

He was recognized at the Cultural Blues awards, receiving a Leadership award for his contribution to Kapa Haka, and his presence on stage, which included the lead role in the school production of 'Mamma Mia'. 
At the present moment, we do not know how much we raised for Baskets of Blessings, but once the sum is announced, the Altrusa Queenstown Club will be very proud of their efforts.
